The following online Library Research Tools and Recommended Websites are great ways for kids (and their teachers) to find reliable, accurate information!

Open access at the Main Library and Ellettsville Branch or from outside the Library with a library card number.

Tools can only be accessed from inside the library.

Tools can be accessed from anywhere without a library card.

World Book Online

Find information fast, including recommended websites, magazine articles, images and maps. Choose the resource that is best suited for your age or information needs.

Kids = Encyclopedia for children in grades K-3.

Student = Encyclopedia designed for children in grades 4-8.

Advanced = Grades 8-12 and **Discover** for Grades 9-12 and older.

Spanish language content is available through **Enciclopedia Estudiantil Hallazgos**.

The **Timelines** tool enables students to create their own timelines as well as examine a time in history.



INSPIRE for Magazine and Newspaper Articles

Find newspaper, magazine and journal articles, many of them full-text. Access the **Kids Search** (geared to children in grades K-6) and the **Student Research Center** (targeted to middle and high school students) through INSPIRE.

Look here for current factual information on oceans and countries from around the world. Provides a picture of the country's flag, along with information on its geography, people, government and more.
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Flags

- Connect to **World Book Online**, and search for the country you are researching.
 - **CIA World Factbook : Flags of the World**
Images of flags from around the world, listed in alphabetical order by country, with a description of the flag and a link to country information.
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Presidents

- **POTUS: Presidents of the United States** - www.ipl.org/div/potus/
Provides background information, election results, cabinet members, presidency highlights, and some odd facts on each of the presidents.

- **Presidents of the United States** ^[1]

Provides fast facts and biographical information about each president. Also includes links to The First Ladies ^[2] - an important part of White House History ^[3].
