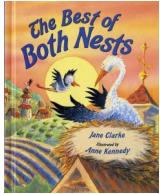

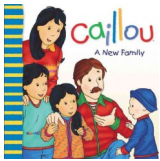


The Best of Both Nests

When Caillou asks his cousins why their mother does not live with their father, he learns about divorce, what it is like to have two homes, and the feelings that his cousins experience.

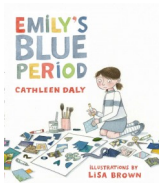


Do You Sing Twinkle? : A Story About Remarriage and New Family

After her parents get divorced, Emily finds comfort in making and learning about art.

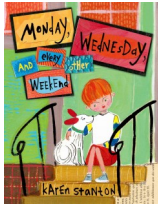


Living with Mom and Living with Dad

A little girl describes what her life is like now that her parents no longer live together.

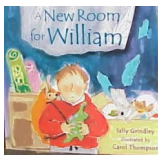


Monday, Wednesday, and Every Other Weekend

Although Henry enjoys the time he spends at his mother's apartment and his father's house, his dog Pomegranate gets confused about which place is home.

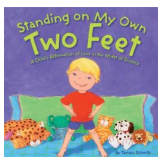


A New Room for William

A young boy named Alex enjoys the homes of both of his parents who live apart but love Alex very much.

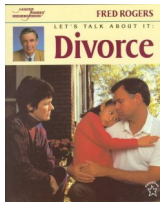

Divorce and Separation

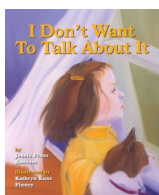
Patricia Murphy

are often experienced by those whose parents have gotten divorced or separated, getting help, and accepting change.

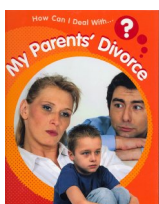


I Don't Want To Talk About It

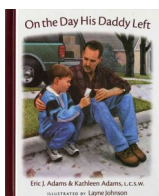


My Parents' Divorce
