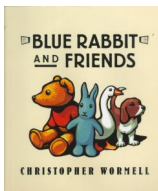


### **Blue Rabbit and the Runaway Wheel**

In search of the wheel that fell off his bicycle, Blue Rabbit encounters several animals, all of whom have been disturbed by a strange "whizzing" object.

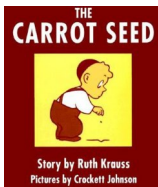


### **Blue Rabbit and Friends**

Chicken's cow visitors try to jump, dance, and wiggle on his couch, which is much too tiny for such exuberant activities.

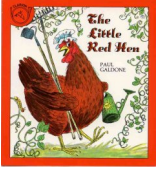


### **Little Pink Pig**

When it is time for bed, a little pink pig lags behind as his mother asks the horse, cow, sheep, and hens to help her find her child.

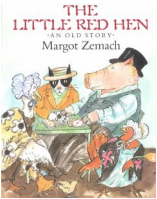


## The Little Red Hen

The little red hen finds none of her lazy friends willing to help her plant, harvest, or grind wheat into flour, but all are eager to eat the cake she makes from it.

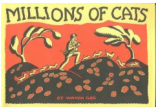


## The Little Red Hen : An Old Story

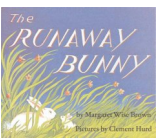


## Millions of Cats

How can an old man and his wife select one cat from a choice of millions and trillions?

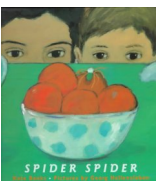


## The Runaway Bunny

A little rabbit who wants to run away tells his mother how he will escape, but she is always right behind him.

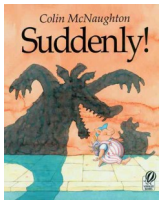


## Spider, Spider

As Peter watches a spider crawl across the floor, he and his mother play at imagining all that they would do if Peter were a spider.

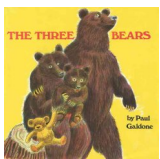


### **Suddenly!**

Time after time, Preston the pig unknowingly outwits a hungry wolf that is trying to catch and eat him.

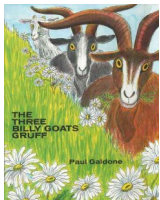


### **The Three Bears**
